

Teacher Feedback on impact on two instructional days

- 36 homeroom teachers ~ 16 homeroom responded, 1 SpEd, and 1 Specialists
 - 10 said yes the conferences were of greater benefit
 - 4 said losing instructional days was a concern
 - 2 had mixed thoughts

875 survey emails were sent out.

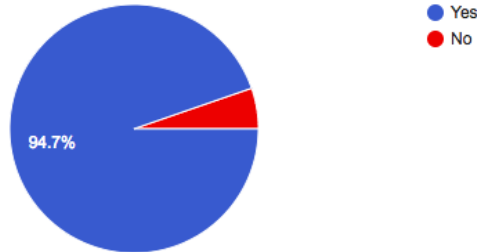
170 responses after 5 days

699 students attended conferences (out of 804) = 87%

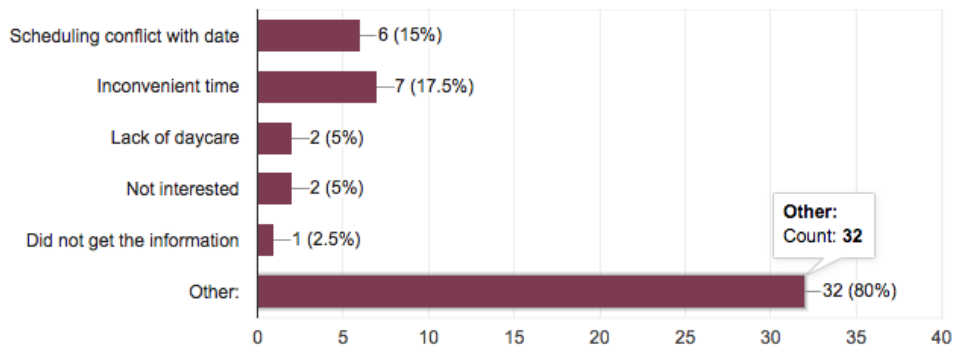
Did you and your child attend Back to School Conferences?

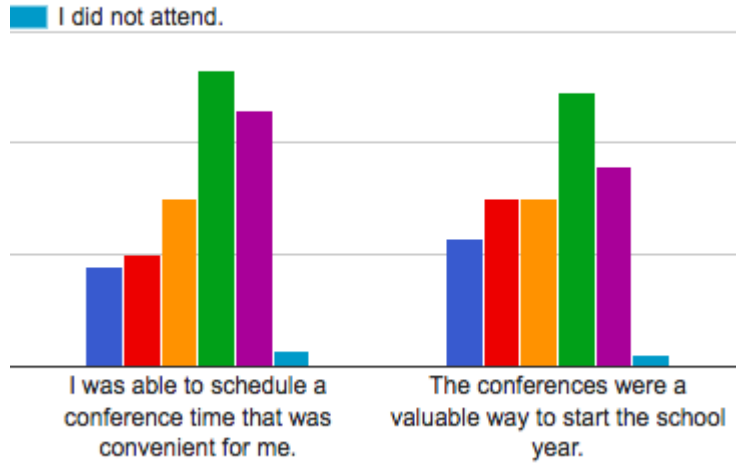
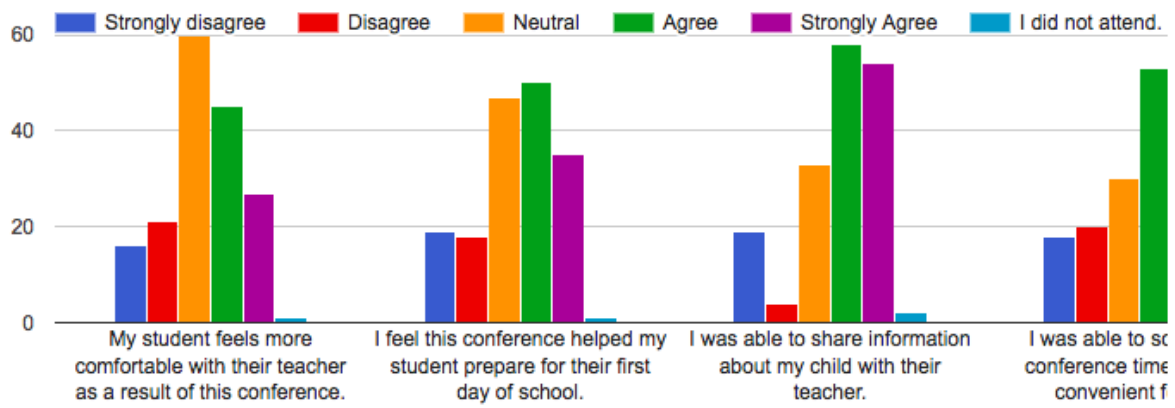

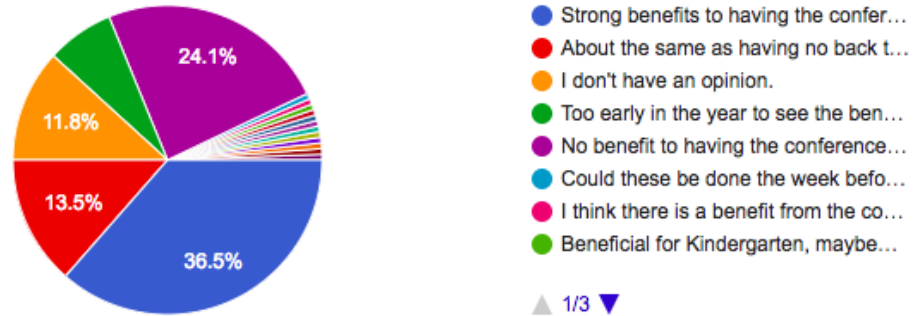




To what degree do you feel the benefits of the 1/2 hour conference are in place of two days of instruction?



170 responses



1st: Strong benefits to having the conference in place of 2 days of instruction. = 36.5% (62)

3rd: About the same as having no back to school conference. = 13.5% (23)

4th: I don't have an opinion. = 11.8% (20)

5th: Too early in the year to see the benefits of the back to school conference and impact on two less instructional days. Ask me in January. = 7.1% (12)

2nd: No benefit to having the conference and missing two days of instruction. = 24.1% (41)

80 responses

- Many comments about having the conferences before school so both HS and Elem. started at the same time
- Open House - but have 1:1 conferences option for those that feel they need it
- Conferences for K-1 and rest Open House
- Misc. feedback about logistics such as when the open times were released
